### **Death of MG (Ret) Guy S. Meloy, III**

We are saddened by the passing of MG (Ret) Guy S. (Sandy) Meloy, III on 25 August 2013 in San Antonio. He was a superb leader who believed in first class training and taking care of soldiers. MG Meloy was with Advisory Team 162 from February to August 1966 serving as Senior Adviser to Task Force I, Vietnamese Airborne. He commanded the 82d Airborne Division from December 1978 to February 1981. His passing is a loss to the Army and the Nation.
